
Theme: Parts of a House




Discuss the following questions:

- What are the parts of a house that protect us from the rain?
- What colors are some of the houses in your neighborhood?
- What color would you paint your house if it could be any color?
- How many windows does your home have? How many doors?
- Why do people like pets? What makes you happy about your pet?
- What things grow outside your house? Did someone plant them, or did they grow on their own?

Building Blanket Forts







- For the WALLS, use some chairs to make the corners of your fort, then use sofa cushions or blankets between the chairs, to make the walls.
- For the ROOF, use big sheets or a blanket over the top of your chairs
- Make sure there is a good spot to sneak in and out of your fort! That's your DOOR!
- Be sure to add lots of comfy pillows and blankets inside your fort.
- You can read books, play games, play pretend with your toys in your fort, or draw or color some awesome pictures, just like you can in your own home!
